

Message from the Club Captain

Well, we have nearly completed yet another busy season at Sawtell Surf Club ... Most of us only have 2 or 3 patrols left before we hang up the red & yellow for another 5 – 6 months, before we can celebrate the successful season that was!

Perfect timing to start thinking about off season training and any additional skills you would like to require before the 2024/25 season commences.

This leads me to continue to discuss patrol frequency ... As many of you may recall, we use to have a strong Club of 12 patrolling teams. This meant patrols came around less often. Unfortunately, as happens in life, we had a few members move from the area, or leave the Surf Club movement. We lost a few key skill requirements and as a result, were required to drop down to 10 patrol teams to ensure we could meet patrolling obligations.

My desire has always been to return to 12 patrolling teams. This would result in all of our patrolling members having to patrol less often, as we would be rotating between 12 teams.

So, this is where I need your help

.... For a patrol to be operational, we are required to have the following key qualifications as absolute minimum:

Silver Medallion Beach Captain (patrol captain) qualification

Advanced First Aid

IRB Driver & Crew

Courses in all these areas are either being run now, or will be running over the off season. Other Clubs are running courses if you have missed our IRB crew (which is being run now and is a pre-requisite to IRB driver) and of course, the Branch will be running several courses. Please please please consider... I am available to talk to, as is your patrol captain and of course our Chief Training Officer, Andrew Martin.

The Club will provide mentor and support on an ongoing basis to anyone who takes on a patrol captain position and has not held that previously should they require it.

We are also all need to be proactive in spreading the word about the benefits of patrolling for your community, the team environment and the awesome culture that exists within our Club and patrolling teams. If we can all encourage friends, work colleagues, and family members to become involved, gain their bronze medallion and join a patrol team, the Club as a whole benefit.

I am also considering having a meeting for all patrolling members at the end of the season to debrief on the year that was... pls stay tuned for more information in that regard.

Enjoy the balance of the season, I am sincerely appreciative of all your efforts and look forward to celebrating the end of the season with you all.

WOMEN IN POWERCRAFT

We are lucky enough to have some amazing women in our club and within the NC Branch. Shelley has been nominated to run the Women in Power Craft IRB Crew and Drivers course. The course started at Sawtell with participants from Sawtell, Woolgoolga, Minnie Water and Bellinger Valley North Beach.

The participants will achieve their IRB Crew or IRB Drivers award in a specifically designed, women-only training course, supported by SLSA. This isn't about equality of outcome, but equality of opportunity. The Power craft space is not for everyone, and certainly not for every woman. Females operate differently in an IRB – technique and mental wellbeing is everything and this needs to be trained differently. We can make a difference by offering the women in our movement the same opportunities to gain these awards, in a safe environment.

The power of women training together is huge, and participants will be part of a supportive group of like-minded members who will assist each other through the course and become champions for each other.

COFFS COAST OCEAN SWIMS

As members would know the Coffs Coast Ocean Swims, an event managed by your Club, is upcoming on **Sunday 7 April**. This event showcases to the public the ability of a Club such as ours to organise a well-regarded event.

As of 27 March there are 205 online entries (96% of whom have an address outside the immediate area) with a further 159 entrants coming from The Armidale School. For TAS, this event is part of a school award called the Triple Crown in which students have to complete various challenge events including the Coffs Coast Ocean Swim and the Tour de Rocks cycle classic from Armidale to South West Rocks. The Coffs swim is also mandatory for those TAS students doing their surf lifesaving with us as Sawtell SLSC. TAS is also using this year's event to promote mental health awareness with the message "it is OK to say you are not OK", and swimmers will wear blue caps as part of the school's Blue Week, tying in with the Blue Tree Project.


PARTNERSHIP WITH THE RURAL FIRE SERVICE AND NSW WATER POLICE

The RFS has teamed up with Surf Life Saving NSW to conduct aerial beach patrols along a 100km stretch of coastline from Red Rock to South West Rocks in the state's north.

The Coffs Harbour based RFS helicopter and crew have on board a volunteer Lifesaver to look out for rips and dangerous surf conditions, isolated swimmers, and other threats such as sharks on busy days.

Aerial patrols commenced and have run twice a day from Coffs Harbour on Saturdays, Sundays, and public holidays during the warmer months.

NSW Water Police joined in with having a visit down at the Urunga Branch carnival and some very lucky bronze members got the opportunity to go on aboard and check out their boat and the coastline. Thanks to Coffs Harbour Water Police for allowing us to have a look at your operations.
